## ***About job application and CV***

Many companies in Finland have their websites also in English and you can find their open vacancies and application forms there. Once you have found a vacancy that interests you, make sure you submit a job application that meets the requirements stated in the job advertisement. Generally, the length of the application/cover letter is one page and the CV max. two pages.

You can contact and send your CV directly to companies even if they do not have open vacancies at that moment. Many companies are happy to accept these so called open applications for future potential recruitments. Take a good look at the company and think about what kind of expertise you have that will benefit the company? What added value could you bring to the company?

Please note that certain professions require Finnish language skills and recognition of qualifications in Finland.
